Dear Families and Children,

Friday 15th September

It has been a busy and wonderful week here in school, the children and staff are all settling in well and I have had the pleasure of eating my lunch with the children, in the hall on Thursday.

Parental Survey March 2023 We are aware that the outcomes from the survey had not been shared with our parents. We had 75 parent survey returned, 55 of those were very positive and 11 questions were submitted.

- 7 disagreed or strongly disagreed that the school has high expectations of your child.
- 5 responses disagreed that when you have raised concerns they have been dealt with properly.
- 7 responses disagreed or strongly disagreed that School lets you know how your child is doing.
- 1 response disagreed that their child can take part in a range of clubs and activities at school.
- 1 response disagreed that school had given the support their child with SEND needed.

Recruitment for Substantive Headteacher

The Governing Body of the school are working alongside the Local Authority to recruit a substantive Headteacher to begin leading the school in January 2024. I will be off site on Friday supporting this rigorous and robust process and you will be informed of the outcome by our Chair of Governors, Mr Peter Brown, in due course.

Headline Data from Summer Term

I'm aware that the headline data from the summer term has not been shared with you. I think it is crucial that all parents are aware of the school's performance and the outcomes for children at Tattenhall Park Primary. Children take a variety of national tests and checks at various points through their primary years and these are reported to the Department for Education and can be viewed by Ofsted at any given time. I am meeting staff and Governors next week in two separate meetings to discuss the data which is below.

Good Level of Development in **Early Years** 76% (national 65% in 2022), these are the current Year 1 children.

Year 1 phonics screening check 88% (national 75% in 2022), these are the current Year 2 children.

KS1 (current Year 3 children)

Reading 54% (national 67% in 2022) and 14% at the higher standard.

Writing at the expected standard is 61% (national 58% in 2022) and 7% at the higher standard.

Maths 71% (national 68% in 2022) and 18% at the higher standard.

Year 4 Multiplication Check (current Year 5)

The average score was 14 out of a possible 25

KS2 (current Year 7)

Reading 76% at expected standard (national 73% in 2022) and 38% at the higher standard

Writing 71% at expected standard (national 69% 2022) and 3% at the higher standard (national 13% 2022)

Maths 59% at expected standard (national 73% in 2022) and 32% at the higher standard

SPAG (Spelling Punctuation and Grammar) 74% at expected standard (national 72% in 2022) and 23% at the higher standard.

As you will see there are clear areas in which the school need to improve, and some of these outcomes may lead to a challenging inspection next time Ofsted visit.

Nut Free
