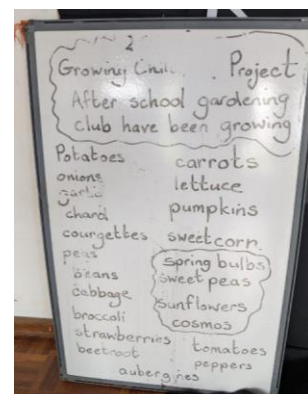




## Eco Schools- Healthy Eating- Competition Time.

Our Eco Team have been busy reviewing our Eco Action plan and have some great plans for the next half term. One of their key ideas is to encourage children to grow and eat some of the vegetables we grow in our school allotment.

Jenny, Fiona and Judy, our fabulous gardening volunteers, put a board out on Sports Day to show people the crops we are currently growing. The Eco Team have created a competition for the children, to design a recipe using at least three vegetables from the allotment list. There are a few simple rules...



The recipe;

- 1) Must have at least three ingredients from the allotment list.
- 2) Can have up to 5 additional ingredients- but the recipe **must be** vegetarian.
- 3) Cannot contain nuts.

**The children need to be able to cook/prepare (with adult assistance) the recipe in a maximum of 40 minutes.** Jenny, Fiona and Judy will pick the three recipes and we will hold a 'cook off' session, after school at the end of term to make the recipe. It will then be tasted and judged by Jenny, Judy and Fiona. There will be a small prize for everyone who enters and prizes for the three finalists. Entry forms will be given out on **Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> June and must be returned by Friday 13<sup>th</sup> June.**
